February and March - Terry Ratchford – Watercolor and Pencil

Terry is a self-taught watercolor and colored pencil artist, from southern Gaston County NC, where she lives with her husband on farm land that has been in his family for seven generations. Terry's art is inspired by objects experienced and seen around her every day. Her work is an opportunity to revisit the childlike joy of being surprised.
